TEMPORARY TRAFFIC DISRUPTION

CHURCHILL ROOSEVELT HIGHWAY / SOUTHERN MAIN ROAD FLYOVER AND ANCILLARY WORKS

The National Infrastructure Development Company Limited (NIDCO) in partnership with the Ministry of Works and Transport (MOWT) wishes to advise the general public (motorists/residents/pedestrians) that there will be a temporary closure of access to and from the **Southern Main Road, North (Curepe) at its intersection with the Churchill Roosevelt Highway (Curepe Interchange).** Works will be executed during the period:

Friday, 6th December 2019 | 8pm to Monday, 9th December 2019 | 4am

The closure is necessary to facilitate construction works associated with the Curepe Interchange Project. During the period of the closure –

this intersection will be closed to ALL vehicular traffic; and motorists wishing to access the Valsayn Branch Road or KFC/Pizza Hut/ Subway may proceed in their usual direction.

ALTERNATIVE ROUTES

Motorists are advised that during this period ONLY, the Priority Bus Route (PBR) will be open from its intersections with the Uriah Butler Highway (Mt. Hope Intersection) to the Macoya Road Intersection.

ACCESS TO SOUTHERN MAIN ROAD (NORTH)

FROM UBH NORTHBOUND - Motorists travelling north along the Uriah Butler Highway (UBH) from San Fernando, Chaguanas and environs who wish to access Southern Main Road (North) should continue along the UBH and turn right onto the Priority Bus Route at the Mt. Hope Intersection. Then proceed along the authorized section and turn right onto Southern Main Road (North) to access their final destination.

FROM CRH WESTBOUND - Motorists travelling west along the Churchill Roosevelt Highway from Arima, Piarco, Trincity and environs who wish to access Southern Main Road (North) should exit the highway and proceed along Macoya Road (North) and then turn left at its intersection with the Priority Bus Route. Then proceed along the authorized section and turn left onto Southern Main Road (North) to access their final destination.

FROM CRH EASTBOUND - Motorists travelling east along Churchill Roosevelt Highway from Port of Spain, El Socorro and environs who wish to access Southern Main Road (North) should exit to the northbound section of the Uriah Butler Highway then turn right onto the Priority Bus Route at the Mt. Hope Intersection. Then proceed along the authorized section and turn right onto Southern Main Road (North) to access their final destination.

FROM SMR SOUTH - Motorists travelling north along Southern Main Road (South) from Caroni, Spring Village and environs who wish to access Southern Main Road (North) should continue north along the Southern Main Road and proceed onto the westbound section of the Churchill Roosevelt Highway. Next, exit the highway and proceed to the northbound section of the Uriah Butler Highway and turn right onto the Priority Bus Route at the Mt. Hope Intersection. Then proceed along the authorized section and turn right onto Southern Main Road (North) to access their final destination

Motorists and residents on Southern Main Road(North) in the vicinity of Curepe and environs who wish to access the Churchill Roosevelt Highway (CRH) may proceed north and utilize the authorized section of the Priority Bus Route only to access the Churchill Roosevelt Highway (CRH).

Motorists are also advised to comply with the following:

- Proceed with caution and drive at a reduced speed on approaching the work zone.
- Observe all temporary directional signage provided on the approaches to the site.
- Comply with instructions issued by police officers on site to facilitate a safe and orderly flow of traffic.
- Be aware of heavy equipment entering and exiting the site.
